## **Guidance Notes**

A second home is any dwelling that is furnished but nobody lives in it as their sole or main residence. From 1st April 2013 there is no discount available and therefore full Council Tax will be payable.

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However, we can reduce the amount of Council Tax by half (50%) if the property is regarded as job-related (see below) or the second home is a pitch occupied by a caravan or a mooring occupied by a boat.

Job-related second home - Where a <u>specific</u> dwelling is provided (under a tenancy or otherwise) to an individual or their spouse by their employer for the better performance of their duties and it is the kind of employment in which it is customary for employers to provide accommodation to employees. You have to be liable for the Council Tax at both your main residence and second home to qualify for the discount (This may not apply if you are a Minister of Religion).

## For example:

- a publican who has their own house but their contract / tenancy requires them to live in the pub.
- a school caretaker who has a family home elsewhere but their contract of employment requires them to occupy accommodation provided by the employer in or next to the school
- a minister of religion who has their own home but has to live in other accommodation provided by the church in order to carry out their duties as a minister.
