Park Open day – August 14th 2010

August 14th will see one of the largest ever Gheluvelt Park community events, stretching from Barbourne Road to the river Severn. There's something for everyone - don't miss it!

The main morning activity is a formal opening of the new memorial feature by the Mayor of Gheluvelt. Throughout the afternoon Ed Steelefox will present musical entertainment from well known local bands. Other events include Worcester's annual flower show, a large marquee with interactive activities for all ages, tethered air balloon flights, duck racing on the stream and a multitude of stalls promoting local interests.

Healthy park activities



As part of the nationwide effort to improve the nation's health, Friends has been approached by the NHS to look into the possibility of installing outdoor gym equipment in the park. We strongly support this initiative, which fits well with our other health related activities, and are considering about half a dozen outside exercise units and two outdoor concrete table tennis units.

Outdoor gym equipment, which has become very popular in the UK over the last couple of years, has already been installed in West Midlands' parks, where it has attracted interest from users of all ages.

This is an early stage project in which we will work with the Council and NHS to agree what is required, then set about the inevitably difficult job of obtaining funding in the present economic climate. Park refurbishment



In early June the fences will be removed from the wet play area, the water turned on, and this new facility declared open. The council's request for dog owners to keep their pets on a lead, according to park bye laws, is important because dog fouling on the wet play area causes it to be shut down for cleaning / disinfecting. Dogs are welcome off the lead on Gheluvelt Riverside Park. Skateboards and cycles, which can damage the surface, are not permitted on the wet area.

The new playground and memorial feature will be complete for Open Day on August 14th.

Tree sculpture project

The proposal for a local tree sculptor to work with children to design a large tree sculpture, which he would then carve in the park, has been delayed because the main funding source (the Arts Council) has turned down our application. This was due to lack of available

funds rather than quality of the project, which has been resubmitted. Feedback is anticipated end July.

Park visitor monitoring

Observant visitors may have queried the mysterious black boxes at the main park gates. These units will soon be fitted at all gates to count visitors entering and leaving the park. They are an HLF requirement, to be used for measuring the effect of the refurbishment on visitor numbers.
