Welcome

During 2019/20 Worcester City Council will spend £21.8 million providing essential services to you. The funding we receive from central Government is being reduced, so this year our element of your Council Tax bill will rise by around 1p per day in order to help us protect your services. You can find out how much you'll pay on page 5.

Worcester City Council collects the Council Tax on behalf of Worcestershire County Council, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for West Mercia, Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Authority and, where necessary, your local parish council. The total amount is then split to provide the services that are part of your everyday life.

This year, the majority of Band D households in Worcester will pay £1,747.63 to their local authorities - that's just £33.60 a week.

Direct Debit - the best way to pay

Make your life easier and pay your bill by Direct Debit

– it can save you money, time and effort (because you
only need to do it once, not every year).

Over 75% of households in Worcester already pay this way – all you need to do is give us your bank account details and we can do the rest.

You have a choice of monthly payment dates - the 1st, 10th, 15th or 25th of the month, whichever suits you best.

And remember – your payments will always be covered by the Direct Debit guarantee.

Investing in your city

Major investments will be made in Worcester as part of the City Council's budget for 2019/20.

- £200,000 will be invested in improvements to your car parks
- £400,000 will be spent on improving and upgrading the city council's CCTV network
- £400,000 will support a revamp of The Shambles
- £145,000 will be invested in new compactor litter bins, to enhance cleanliness and tidiness in the city centre
- £100,000 will be invested in the creation of The Kiln, a new city centre co-working space for freelancers and creatives
- £236,000 will be spent on new temporary accommodation for people at risk of homelessness
- £77,000 will be used to support local people who are facing particular financial difficulties and are struggling to pay their Council Tax arrears

A new future for historic arches

Your City Council is leading a £4.5m project to revamp the historic railway arches to provide a new walkway from Foregate St station to The Hive and the riverside. The area will become a major new cultural destination for the city, providing a hub for business and creative skills development.

Eight of the arches will be refurbished, becoming dynamic work and creative spaces, and a Festivals Hub will be established to deliver festivals and cultural events across Worcester.

£3m of Government funding will help transform the arches into a cultural destination for tourists and our local communities.

The City Council's partners in the development are the University of Worcester, Severn Arts, Network Rail, Worcestershire County Council, Worcestershire Arts Partnership, The Hive and local businesses including Burger Shop and Method Roastery.

The City Council's share of the total Band D Council Tax is £185.88; this is a £5.40 rise on the previous year, but the increase is lower for the majority of city households.

Your Council Tax bill also includes charges for Worcestershire County Council, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for West Mercia, Hereford & Worcester Fire and Rescue Authority.

Worcestershire County Council's Council Tax is less than the average of comparable counties.

2018/19 Council Tax for Counties without Fire



This year the County Council's income is increasing due to Worcestershire's growing economy. Growth in the local economy generates more income from business rates. The building of more homes in the county has led to an increase in council tax revenue.

Supporting vulnerable adults and children accounts for more than 70% of council expenditure with adult social care and health receiving £139m of the council income and support for children and community services getting £108.7m.

£55.3m of the council income will be spent on highways, planning, transport and household waste disposal.

The remaining £27.4m of the expenditure goes onto support services and debt repayment.

This year's council tax will be increased by 3.99%, with 2.99% to support the general budget and 1% ring-fenced for Adult Social Care. The increase is equivalent to 93p per week extra on a Band D property.

The additional investments in this year's budget include:

- **£14.1m** for Adult Social Care
- £7.8m for children's social care
- £3m to support economic development
