Welcome

During 2020/21 Worcester City Council will spend £22.5 million providing essential services to you. Our costs are increasing in line with inflation so this year our element of your Council Tax bill will rise by around 1p per day in order to help us protect your services. You can find out how much you'll pay on page 5.

Worcester City Council collects the Council Tax on behalf of Worcestershire County Council, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for West Mercia, Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Authority and, where necessary, your local parish council. The total amount is then split to provide the services that are part of your everyday life.

This year, the majority of Band D households in Worcester will pay £1,813.12 to their local authorities - that's just £34.87 a week.

Direct Debit - the best way to pay

Make your life easier and pay your bill by Direct Debit

– it can save you money, time and effort
(because you only need to do it once, not every year).

Over 75% of households in Worcester already pay this way – all you need to do is give us your bank account details and we can do the rest.

You have a choice of monthly payment dates - the 1st, 10th, 15th or 25th of the month, whichever suits you best.

And remember – your payments will always be covered by the Direct Debit quarantee.



Investing in your city

Major investments will be made in Worcester as part of the City Council's budget for 2020/21.



- £2,850,000 investment in sport development, including new football and hockey facilities
- £310,000 will be contributed to the £4.5m revamp of The Arches Worcester
- £100,000 will be invested in further improvements to your car parks
- £695,000 for providing at-home facilities for people living with disabilities
- £25,000 will be invested in additional promotion of Worcester as a tourist destination
- £109,000 to improve play areas across the city, including new fencing around the popular Splashpad in Gheluvelt Park

The City Council's share of the total Band D Council Tax is £190.88; this is a £5 rise on the previous year, but the increase is lower for the majority of city households.





Worcestershire continues to boast one of the fastest growing economies in the country, creating more homes, jobs and businesses

Council Tax will increase by 3.99% for 2020/21. This will be made up of 2% ring fenced for Adult Social Care and 1.99% to support the delivery of other services.

The increase is the equivalent to less than £1 per week for a band D property and means Council Tax rates in Worcestershire will continue to be amongst the lowest 25% of all county councils.

In the coming year, we will:

- Invest an extra £18 million into children's and adult's social care
- Double the Council's spending on schemes to reduce traffic congestion
- Support the environment and begin a programme to plant 150,000 new trees to create new woodlands
- Continue to improve flood mitigation measures as well as upgrading thousands more street lights to more energy efficient LED lights.
